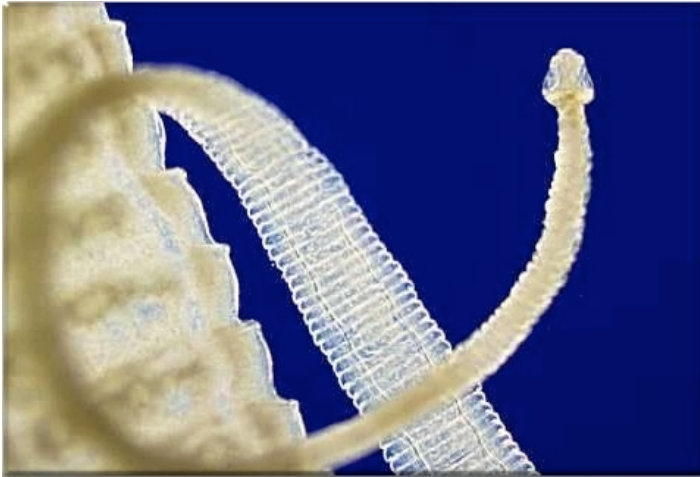


# Internal Parasites

## **Facts about parasites in dogs and cats**

- Your cat/dog can appear perfectly healthy but still can carry parasites
- They often show signs of disease only when the infection/infestation is already serious
- If we can't see the parasites, it does not mean that they are not there
- You can get infected with parasitic worms through your pet
- Especially children are at risk of getting infected with parasitic worms when they play in areas that are infected with dog- or cat faeces (gardens, parks, beaches, sand boxes)
- If you travel abroad with your pet, always check with your veterinarian what is required with regard to de-worming

## **What can you do to prevent infection with parasitic worms**

- Have your pet de-wormed at least 4 times a year
- Make sure that puppies and kittens are de-wormed regularly. Puppies as of 2 weeks of age and kittens as of 3 weeks
- Have your kids wash their hands after they have been playing outside.
- Clean up your pet's faeces by using poop scoops or pooh bags.

## **Treatment of worm infection in your pet**
